ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

- 1. The Palestine Liberation Organization (for the benefit of the Palestinian Authority), (the Recipient) will implement West Bank and Gaza Resilient Municipal Services Project (P178723) as part of the "Municipal Development Program- Phase 4 (MDP4)" Project (the Project) and Additional Financing-Resilient Municipal Services Project (P181678), with the involvement of the Ministry of Finance, the Municipal Development and Lending Fund (MDLF) on behalf of the Ministry of Local Government, as set out in the Grant Agreement and the Project Agreement. The International Development Association, acting as the administrator of the Palestinian Umbrella for Resilience Support to the Economy Trust Fund, has agreed to provide for the Project. This ESCP supersedes previous versions of the ESCP for the Project and shall apply both to the original and the additional financing for the Projects referred to above.
- 2. The Recipient shall ensure that the Project is carried out in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs) and this Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP), in a manner acceptable to the Association. The ESCP is a part of the Grant Agreement and the Project Agreement. Unless otherwise defined in this ESCP, capitalized terms used in this ESCP have the meanings ascribed to them in the referred agreements.
- 3. Without limitation to the foregoing, this ESCP sets out material measures and actions that the Recipient shall carry out or cause to be carried out, including, as applicable, the timeframes of the actions and measures, institutional, staffing, training, monitoring and reporting arrangements, and grievance management. The ESCP also sets out the environmental and social (E&S) instruments that shall be adopted and implemented under the Project, all of which shall be subject to prior consultation and disclosure, consistent with the ESS, and in form and substance, and in a manner acceptable to the Association. Once adopted, said E&S instruments may be revised from time to time with prior written agreement by the Association.
- 4. As agreed by the Association and the Recipient, this ESCP will be revised from time to time if necessary, during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to Project performance. In such circumstances, the Recipient and the Association agree to update the ESCP to reflect these changes through an exchange of letters signed between the Association and the Recipient, General Manager of the Municipal Development and Lending fund. The Recipient shall promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
